



Walk Dogs

There is mandatory orientation/training for all volunteers.

Major Objective: To enhance the lives of shelter dogs by providing enrichment and exercise this helps them to maintain their adoptability.

Responsibilities:

- Understanding kennel dog's behaviors.
- Learn how to get one dog out of the kennel with multiple dogs barking, trying to get your attention, etc.
- Leashing dog.
- Physical requirements are necessary.
- Walking dog around specified areas, be aware of surroundings (unleashed stray animals approaching, snakes, or any other things that could arise while out on your walk.)
- Maintain control of your dog.
- Great customer service skills.
- Animal handling skills.

Training:

- Complete Volunteer Application
- Interview with Volunteer Coordinator
- Attend Volunteer Orientation
- Specialized training (safe handling class, body language) with behaviorist or behavior assistant.

Commitment:

- Volunteer a minimum of 8 hours a month participate in the program for one year, read and follows SOP, always checks in and out on the sign in sheet.

Supervision:

Direct supervision volunteer coordinator or specially trained volunteer.
