Updates:

Customers are under the impression that we will supply medicine for dogs that have kennel cough and cats that have URI. This is **inaccurate** information. It is up to the vet staff to determine if and how much medicine, will be going home with the animals.

Please do not tell the public that an animal is or is not sick and will or will not be going home with meds or on contract until the adoption exam has been performed and vet staff has made that decision.

Due to reduced staffing and supervision, we will no longer be having volunteers come in on Sundays.

Starting November 1st, we will be closing the shelter at 5pm on Saturdays. Customers must be in line by 4:30pm to adopt.

November 4th- December 31st dogs and cats are free to veterans with valid ID.

The Wednesday shot clinic next month will be on Tuesday December 6, instead of Wednesday because of our employee annual meeting.

Dog pricing is \$95 plus \$10 micro-chip, plus license and cats have been reduced to \$5 plus \$10 micro-chip.

Volunteer Choice for Employee of the Month Felix Rubalcava


