If you are requested to help in other areas of the shelter by an employee, you must first check in with your team leader. Please respect your assigned leaders as this will keep us all better organized.

- On July 24th, the Volunteer Department had their first meeting with all of the Volunteers. A lot of information was shared and there was time for you, the Volunteers, to ask questions and get feed back from Candace and Flora. It was well attended with 34 Volunteers. The next meeting is scheduled for August 28th, from 4pm—5pm. Please come and bring your thoughts and questions.
- The Work Release Program is here to complete specific work. Volunteers and Employees of the Shelter are not to talk with the Work Release Program participants. If you have a question about this, please talk to Candace, Joel or Gile.
- Disease Prevention: We have been advised by our Clinic that we must wash our hands with soap and water after handling dogs to help keep down the amount of diseases that are here at the shelter. The antibacterial product helps, but does not kill the Parvo virus.
- Kennel Keys: To obtain kennel keys, we will only ask for Driver Licenses and School ID's. Cell phones and car keys will no longer be required to obtain kennel keys. You will need to hand in either your Driver Licenses or School ID.
