#### Reminders

- Wash your hands with soap and water every time you put a cat or dog back in their kennel. Do not touch another animal until your hands are washed. This helps prevent spreading diseases.
- \* DAS Policy states volunteers are only to handle adoptable animals. Only employees are allowed to handle new animals coming into the shelter.
- Do not walk dogs that are younger than 6 months old.
- \* Puppy Room: Only 2 to 4 Volunteers in the puppy room at any time.
- Receiving: Do not cross the line on the floor upon entering. This is for your protection. Staff will help you when they are available. When waiting for help, please DO NOT touch the animals that are in the kennels that are to your right or left. These animals are injured or sick.

## **Adoptions**

- In the last 45 days, the shelter has adopted out 1,200 animals! Yes, you are reading right! That is 1,200 animals lives saved because of the dedication and hard work of our volunteers and employees. Thank you!
- Adoptions: If a constituent asks about adoption versus a "contract," direct this adopter to a DAS employee. Please DO NOT discuss contracts with adopters.
- If a customer brings in their dog and needs to do a meet and greet with their potential new pet, you must get an animal care technician. Please do not do a meet and greet yourself.
