## Reminders

- ADOPTION PROCESS: All animals that are being adopted must go for a vet check, even if they are staying for their spay/neuter surgery.
- GROOMING ROOM: Please place all dirty towels inside a plastic bag before dropping it off in the laundry room.
- VISITATIONS: Please do not to give out any medical or behavioral advice/promises to potential adopters at any moment during the adoption process. If they have any questions regarding anything medical or behavioral, refer them to a staff member.
- KENNEL CONDUCT: Do not sit on the counters in the kennels. If you need a break, there are benches located right outside the kennels, tables and chairs in the training center, or seats in the Volunteer Modular.
- CELL PHONES: Never use your cell phone in public view, especially if you are holding an animal! If you need to make a call, you may do so in the Volunteer Sign-In Office or Volunteer Modular.
- KENNEL CARDS: We've now added a new kennel card color. All puppies 6 months and under will have a yellow kennel card. Please try to keep puppy handling to a minimum to avoid disease spread.

## Pet Corner!

With Halloween coming up soon, make sure to give your animals petfriendly treats! Here are some recipes taken from the ASPCA website:



#### For your feline friends, the "Halloween Cat Cookie":

#### **Ingredients:**

1/4 cup warm water

5 tablespoons parmesan cheese

3 tablespoons soft margarine

1 tablespoon cod liver oil

1 cup white flour

1/4 cup soy flour



#### **Steps:**

- 1. Preheat oven to 300 degrees Fahrenheit
- 2. Combine water, cheese, margarine, and oil
- 3. Add flour and form dough.
- 4. Roll to 1/4 inch thick and cut with small holiday cookie cutters.
- 5. Bake on an ungreased cookie sheet for 20 to 25 minutes, or until golden.

### For your canine friends, the "Peanut Butter and Pumpkin Pooch Treats": Steps:

2 1/2 Cups whole wheat flour

1/2 cup fresh or canned pumpkin (not seasoned pie filling)

1/2 cup peanut butter

2 teaspoons cinnamon

1 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 cup water as needed

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit
- 2. Whisk together flour, baking powder, pumpkin, peanut butter and cinnamon in a bowl.
- 3. Add water as needed, but the dough should be stiff and dry.
- 4. Roll to 1/2 inch thick and cut with holiday cookie cutters.
- 5. Bake for about 40 minutes, or until hard.
